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
Performance Since Inception

Investment Manager Commentary

Amid volatile global backdrop due to coronavirus outbreak, Indonesia bond market managed to post positive performance in January. Demand for Indonesia bonds remain strong with foreign investor posted IDR13 trillion net buy in the bond market. Main catalyst for the bond market in January was stable domestic macroeconomic condition and attractive Indonesia bond yield level. Inflation remain manageable at 2.68% YoY in January and foreign reserves rose by USD2.5 billion to USD131.7 billion. Rupiah appreciated 1.52% against USD to 13,655. Portfolio allocation in short-tenor bonds posted positive attribution for portfolio performance in January.
