


Monthly Performance Last 3 Years

Investment Manager Commentary

Global stock markets, including Indonesia were mostly down in September triggered by concerns over global economy recovery prospect and persistent pandemic. Jakarta large scale social restriction for the second time starting 14 September also weighed the sentiment of Indonesia financial market, JCI weakened by 7.03%. There was a large foreign outflow from the stock market valued at IDR15.61 trillion. Indonesia macro economy continued to show a mixed picture. In September the economy posted the third consecutive deflation, making annual inflation of 1.42% YoY. Foreign reserve declined to USD135.15 billion in September from record breaking USD137.04 billion in August. Rupiah weakened by 2.18% against USD. Nifty in IDR rose by 0.21%. Portfolio allocation in industrials and IT posted positive attribution, while allocation in real estate and materials posted negative attribution.

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
