Investment Manager Commentary

In September Indonesia macro indicators continued showing recovery. Continued mobility restrictions have resulted in sharp declines of new daily cases and hospital bed occupancy rates. The positive developments supported Indonesia equity market performance, it outperformed the MSCI World, MSCI Emerging Market and MSCI Asia Pacific ex Japan which declined as there were Covid-19 flare ups, energy crisis and as the world embraces the upcoming Fed tapering. Foreign investors in Indonesia equity market booked monthly net foreign inflow of IDR4.37 trillion. Successful pandemic mitigation and execution of reforms are crucial factors to improve investor confidence, financial markets and the economy going forward. Portfolio allocation in energy and real estate contributed positive attribution, meanwhile allocation in communication services and consumer discretionary contributed negative attribution to performance.
