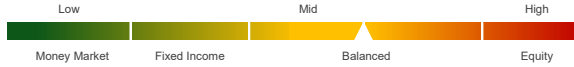

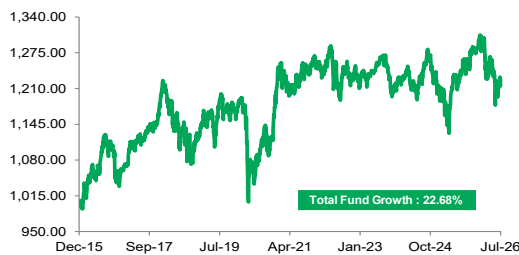

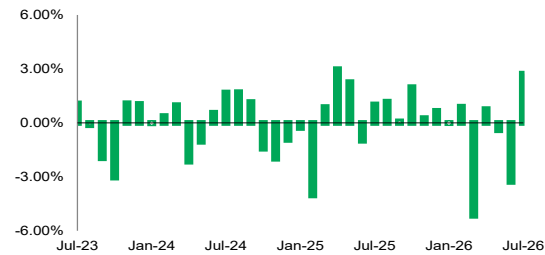

Monthly Performance Last 3 Years



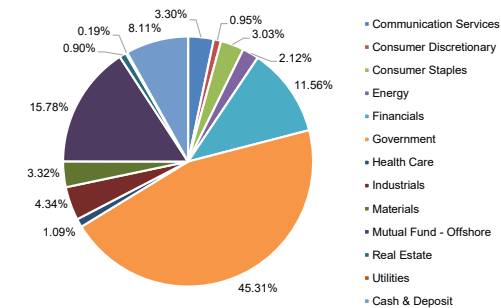

Investment Manager Commentary

The equity market rebounded in July while the bond market was volatile. Market sentiment was overshadowed by renewed geopolitical tensions stemming from the escalating US-Iran conflict and the risk of higher oil prices to global inflation. Brent crude oil prices moved higher as the conflict disrupted key shipping routes through the Strait of Hormuz and the Bab el-Mandeb Strait. Meanwhile, The Fed kept its policy rate unchanged at 3.50%-3.75%, in line with market expectations. However, the FOMC consensus turned more hawkish, with three policymakers voting in favor of a rate hike. On the domestic front, S&P Global Ratings reaffirmed Indonesia's sovereign credit rating at 'BBB' with a Stable outlook, in contrast to Fitch and Moody's, which had previously revised Indonesia's outlook downward. Bank Indonesia maintained BI Rate at 5.75%, signaling a preference to preserve Rupiah stability around the 18,000 level for the time being. The government reported a fiscal deficit of 0.76% of GDP as of end-June and projected a 2026 fiscal deficit of IDR 734.3 trillion (2.85% of GDP), emphasizing its commitment to fiscal discipline. On the other hand, markets were surprised by the resignation of Perry Warjiyo as Governor of Bank Indonesia. Market reaction was relatively muted, as investors awaited clarity on the credibility and policy direction of the incoming central bank governor.

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
